There were a number of questions from the audience at the recent event.

Question	Response
Where should houses     be built within the Plan     boundary if     development has to     happen?	It will ultimately be the villager's decision as a whole. The Eaton Neighbourhood Plan is fundamental to gaining this decision and agreeing any potential site allocations, if any at all. There are many factors to take into consideration that will affect this final decision. The questionnaire and subsequent Analysis Report has laid the foundation to seeking villager's viewpoints and this will be explored further as the Plan evolves.
2. What is the timescale for using specialists for any research work work for the Plan?	This will commence as soon as possible by the Team, after liaising with relevant members of the Cheshire East Council. The aim is to involve external specialist consultants over the next few months to support the Plan. Funding for these costs can be sourced directly from local Government.
3. Is the Neighbourhood Plan set in stone once published, can it be reviewed if circumstances arise or change?	We are still unsure about this point and we will liaise with Cheshire East to seek full clarification.
4. What would happen if School Lane were to be closed?	As far as we are aware there are no plans to do this at all.

5. Are there any plans to review the level of air pollution within the village?	We need to investigate this matter further and this topic may be part of external consultancy work carried out in due course to support the Plan. Within the recent questionnaire question C5 asked the villagers: "Are there any other forms of pollution in Eaton that should be addressed?" Of the 150 responses 5 villagers did make a comment on vehicle pollution, with a further 5 comments on pollution from the Quarry. At this stage it appears that this is not a significant issue, however it will be passed onto the Parish Council to consider.
6. If a mains gas supply was brought into the village would all residents transfer to this service?	Currently there is no intention that anyone is aware of that a gas mains supply will be provided to any part of Eaton.
7. How can the residents help with the Neighbourhood Plan?	<ul> <li>By volunteering their services to help the existing team and join the group to drive the Plan forward over the next few months</li> <li>By volunteering in the Speed Watch campaign on the A536 Macclesfield Road</li> <li>By positively supporting the team members where required</li> <li>By having a positive impact on the forthcoming Neighbourhood Plan referendum to ensure our Plan gets full approval and passed.</li> </ul>
